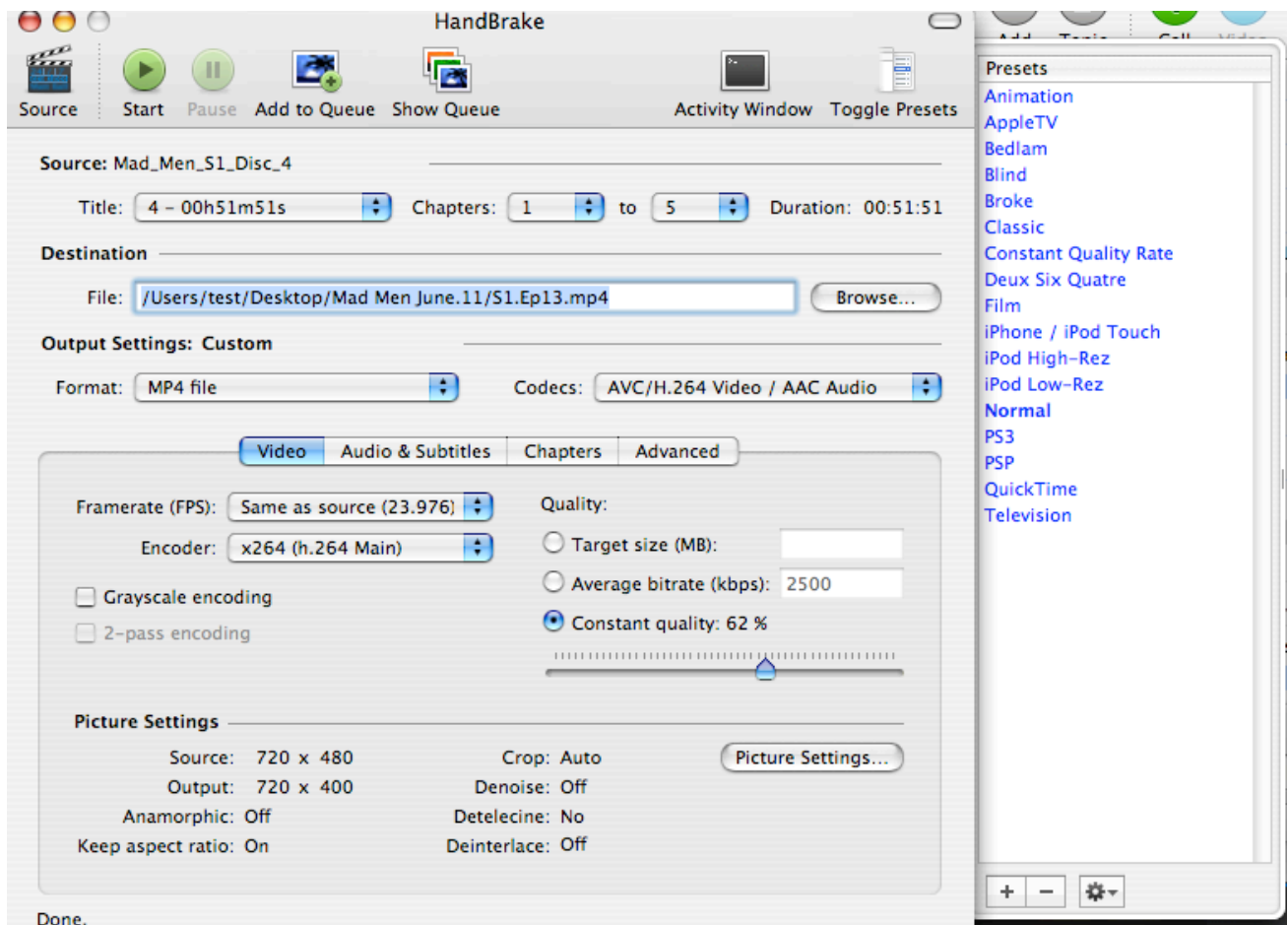


# POPCULTURE PIRATE

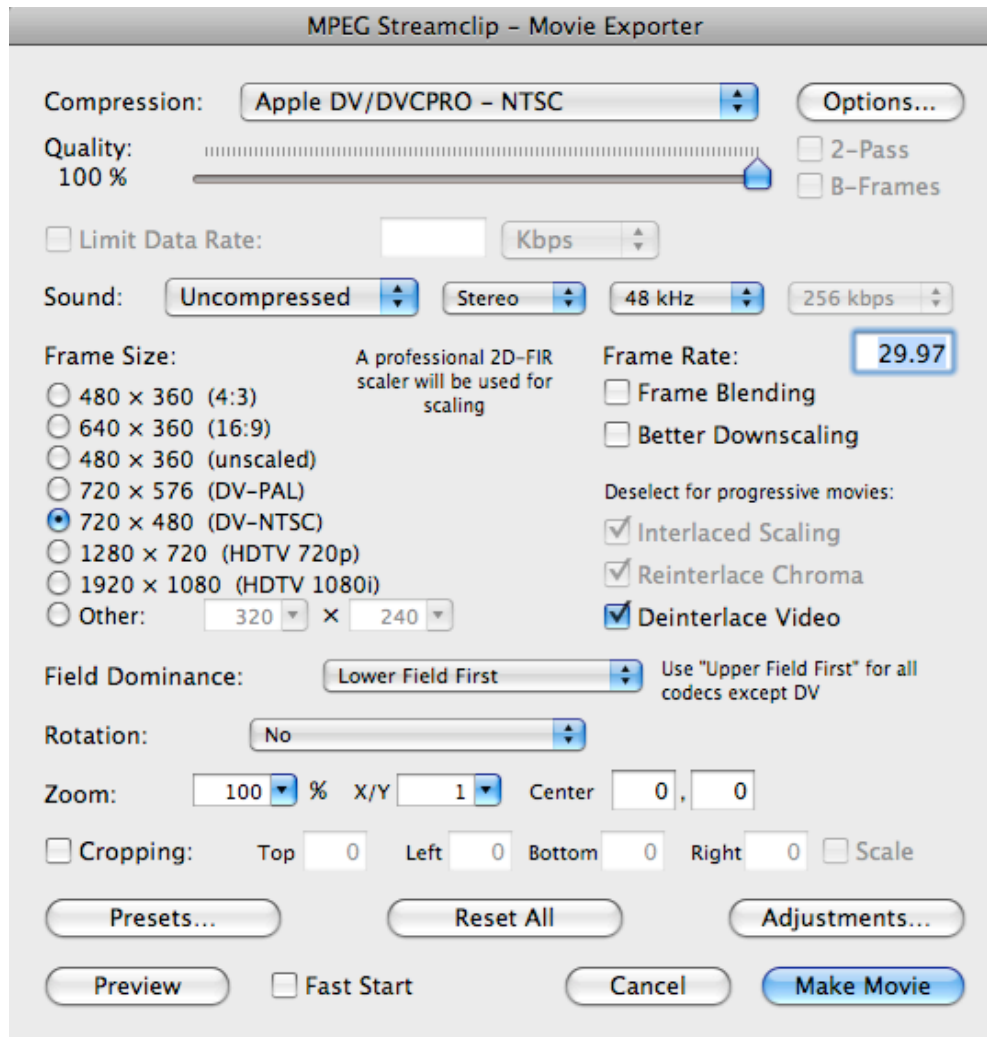
Already have a DVD you'd like to rip and remix? Maybe you acquired it from the library, NetFlix or burned from your DVR. It's easy to rip it for remixing purposes and it's also legal under Fair Use (just in case you were wondering). I streamlined the workflow and the following process can be used for editing your video in Final Cut or iMovie.

1. Insert the DVD into your computer. Open the DVD's icon on the desktop and you'll find a VIDEO\_TS folder with lots of other files in there. Now it just needs to be converted into one file.
2. You **must have VLC player installed** in order to run **Handbrake**, our ripping software. Both are free programs that are great to have on your computer to rip DVDs for watching on iPods, iPhones, etc. Download them I promise you'll use them.
3. Once you've downloaded VLC and Handbrake, launch them both. In Handbrake, select "Source" (upper Left hand corner) and select your DVD, then the Video\_TS folder. Use the setting pictured below and click "start".





4. The result is one ripped mpeg4 file that now has to be converted to be compatible with Final Cut Pro/Express/iMovie to be edited.
5. Download the last free piece of software called **Mpeg Streamclip**.
6. Select the settings below and click "Make Movie".



7. After completing the conversion, import the new file into Final Cut Pro (or iMovie) and you should find your file plays on the timeline without rendering.
